Beware the Rouse Project

It says "the significant investments we make in our shared quality of life...should be invested in ways that reflect our values..."

Bullshit.

Whenever a group of people fitting the profile of the steering committee talks about diversity, hold on to your wallets, because that all they are after. This project is all about gaining control of the Columbia Association for the sole purpose of siphoning taxpayer dollars for private gain.

It says so in their list or priorities, to "Create accountable systems that direct resources more responsibly and effectively."

This post will detail that the systems that members of this steering committee created while serving in public office has created less accountability and has allowed them do direct resources to help their campaign contributors.

The Rouse Project Steering Committee

The steering committee comprises of the who's who of the Howard County political establishment. This group of people has been feeding at the trough of public funds and grown accustomed to easy access to unaccountable grants approved by some of the same politicians at the helm of the committee.

Take for example, Democrat Ken Ulman. There has been no elected official who was more invested in the enrichment of Howard County's developers than former County Executive Ken Ulman. During his tenure (2006 to 2014), Howard County's zoning laws were written and rewritten to fit the developers' needs, constantly fine-tuning county code to create the most optimal and profitable environment while creating undue burden on the county budget and infrastructure.

The same goes for Republican Alan Kittleman, who oversaw the funding of the new courthouse through a shady public-private partnership (P3), the generous tax increment financing to Howard Hughes Corporation, and other disastrous zoning and land-use laws.

If it has not already occurred to the reader by now, Howard County is largely run by politicians who are beholden to wealthy developers. Mr. Ulman and Mr. Kittleman are prime examples of this bipartisan leadership toward continuous decline of the very infrastructure, which attracts families far and wide to settle here.

Today Democrat Calvin Ball has taken the reins and has not disappointed his campaign contributors as his administration contemplates hundreds of millions of dollars in corporate welfare via the General Plan update.

These are just the leading cast members of this audacious attempt to hijack the Columbia Association's election process, under the guise of diversity and inclusion. There are former council members, former board of education members, a former state delegate, former Columbia Association members, a current Howard County Democratic Central Committee member, former county staffers, former President of Howard County General, and the business interests who are likely the beneficiaries of this operation.

The Political Establishment's Diversity and Inclusion Con

The members of this steering committee are skilled at manipulating the public and they employ a very familiar and handy playbook.

Establishment politicians rely on this playbook to embellish their credentials. Just a few months ago, national leaders donned African Kente clothing to show solidarity with

African Americans in reaction to George Floyd's murder, while those same leaders were and continue to be the authors of some of the most egregious pieces of legislation that

have created and exacerbated income inequality and mass incarceration.

Howard County politicians draw from the same playbook.

Mr. Ken Ulman is no different. Just google <u>"Howard County</u> <u>Racist Sheriff."</u> Sheriff James Fitzgerald was elected the same



year as the former county executive, in 2006. He received the endorsement of several prominent local democrats throughout his reign despite his widely known behavior. In an Office of Human Rights (OHR) investigation, one witness said "He's gotten away with it his whole career!"

Mr. Alan Kittleman, who vetoed legislation that would have made Howard County a Sanctuary County, is known for throwing around his dad's experience at the Howard County National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) to burnish his credentials with the African American voter.

Mr. Calvin Ball, the first African American Howard County Executive, elected at a time of intense hostility against undocumented immigrants, who when he was a Council Member introduced the Sanctuary County legislation that Mr. Kittleman vetoed, is just another elected official with hollow political rhetoric. His administration continues to maintain a detention center contract with the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and so far he has declined to take action on implementing a police body camera program.

And yet, all three politicians have spent their entire careers collecting hundreds of thousands of dollars from wealthy developers, while approving zoning laws and shepherding county-sponsored programs that asymmetrically accrue to the benefit of their developer backers. Sometimes in breathtaking ways.

So who are the rest of the key players of the Rouse Project cabal? Many of these people are responsible for the decline in the amenities and the diminished quality of life. Just look at the Downtown Columbia Plan and its giveaways to Howard Hughes Corporation (HHC).

The Rouse Project reeks of influence and self-dealing. It is a plot to take over the Columbia Association to clear the way for unhindered pillaging of taxpayer dollars in the name of "Rouse's Vision."

They have two interrelated possible motives. The first has to do with the Merriweather Post Pavilion. The other has to do with the General Plan. Why they are interrelated will become apparent.

Two of the members of the steering committee have a direct link to the Merriweather Post Pavilion: Brad Canfield and Jean Parker. The aforementioned bipartisan group of politicians are beneficiaries of their generosity. Historical campaign contributions of Mr. Brad Canfield and Ms. Jean Parker via Merriweather Post Pavilion shows that they have collectively contributed \$45, 150.

To answer this question, the reader needs to be familiar with a few organizations and more names.

It's My Amphitheater (IMA)	IMA is the operator of the Merriweather Post Pavilion amphitheater
Downtown Columbia Arts and Culture Commission (DCACC)	A non-profit created to funnel taxpayer dollars in the name of theater and the arts. It became owner of the Merriweather Post Pavilion in 2016 as part of a deal with Howard Hughes Corporation.
Inner Arbor Trust (IAT)	Another non-profit created to funnel more taxpayer dollars to help facilitate the transfer of taxpayer dollars to a boondoggle project.
Columbia Assocation (CA)	Board Members of the CA in 2012 were instrumental in the creation of the IAT.
Merriwheather Post Business Trust (MPBT)	A holding entity owned by Howard Hughes Corporation (HHC). It owned the Merriweather Post Pavilion, which was transferred to DCACC.
Howard Hughes Corporation (HHC)	HHC is the master developer in charge of implenting the Downtown Columbia Plan. Over the years, it has received hundreds of millions in economic giveways from at least three county executives.

It's My Amphitheater (IMA)

It's My Amphitheater (IMA) operates Merriweather Post Pavilion and is owned by Brad Canfield. Mr. Canfield, who also owns the <u>entity that runs the Symphony of Lights</u>, has contributed significant to politicians over the years stands to benefit from the Columbia Association takeover.

Downtown Columbia Arts and Culture Commission (DCACC)

Downtown Columbia Arts and Culture Commission (DCACC) was established in 2013 as a 501(c)3. Before General Growth Properties (GGP) declared bankruptcy and sold its stake to Howard Hughes Corporation, County Executive Ken Ulman worked with GGP to arrange a massive economic giveaway program in exchange for so-called "community enhancements."

One of these community enhancements was to transfer ownership of Merriweather Post Pavilion to DCACC, which would also receive county grant funds to renovate MPP. The main beneficiary of this transaction were of course the developer Howard Hughes Corporation, the owner of MPP before it was given to DCACC and of course IMA.

The following is from CB58-2009, establishing the community enhancements.

DCACC helps facilitate government resources to benefit IMA, the operator of MPP, in more ways than one. <u>Here's a story of how the Howard County Police Department did not bill the</u> Merriweather Post Pavilion for overtime shifts officers worked to provide security at events. Between 2013 and 2016, the county audit found that the department spent \$3.8 million in unreimbursed overtime.

Inner Arbor Trust (IAT)

The Inner Arbor Trust (IAT) was also established in 2013 as another 501(c)3. County Executive Ken Ulman also played a role in forming this organization.

In February 2013, the president of the Columbia Association Phil Nelson prepared a memo of recommendations that outlined the plan to create IAT.

It would receive public money through county and state grants to facilitate the transformation of Symphony Woods to a park.

In his memo, Mr. Nelson states that county government wants to establish the Trust. County government was code for Ken Ulman. Ostensibly, the main purpose of this funding was to finance the boondoggle Chrysalis structure. This was just a portion of the so-called McCall plan as described in Phil Nelson's memo. In the memo, Mr. Nelson also described a straw-poll that was held in October 2012.

There appears to be no meeting minutes for this straw-poll, except for the closed meeting summary shown here.

Background:

- · CA recently received important approvals from the County Planning Board of its Final Design Plan for Symphony Woods Park. The approvals included the Merriweather/Symphony Woods Neighborhood Concept Plan, the Merriweather/Symphony Woods implementation Plan and the Final Design Plan for the first phase of Symphony Woods Park. These approvals provide the important foundation for the development, subsequent submission, and approval of park site development plans.
- The Planning Board placed conditions on the approvals related to: (1) the preservation of existing trees, routing of pathways and grading; and (2) the need for continued coordination between CA and the Howard Hughes Corporation. This past fall, management asked the CA Board for a pause in the process so that CA could work collaboratively with Howard County and Howard Hughes and gain a better determination as to what enhancements the Howard Hughes Corporation was going to make to Merriweather Post Pavilion, which comprises ten acres in the Merriweather/Symphony Woods Neighborhood, as designated in the Downtown Columbia Plan. During the Howard County development approval process it became quite apparent that the County , Howard Hughes, and other community leaders favored what has been referred to as the "McCall Plan" as a master plan for the entire neighborhood.
- While there has been talk about developing a joint venture to include CA, Howard County and Howard Hughes, development of the joint venture may be premature.
- Representatives of the Howard County government have indicated that they would like to proceed with development of the Merriweather/Symphony Woods Neighborhood via partnership of several different entities to form a multi-party trust.
- Management's recommendations herein are based on unanimous Board straw votes at the October 11, 2012 Meeting where the Board expressed support for the following actions
 - · Look at the possibilities of entering into a Trust.
 - Whether to continue with the plan approved by the County Planning Board 0 or investigate other options for continuing through the County's approval process. O Consider placing a CA Headquarters Building in Symphony Woods Park.

Another notable item for the memo references the socalled "McCall Plan." Mr. Michael McCall would become the

first president of the IAT. It can be seen from the IAT's form 990 filings that Mr. McCall received \$1,026,175 in direct compensation and payment to his firm Strategic Leisure Inc. The report also shows that IMA received \$254,569 in 2017 and 2018 as an independent contractor.

At the time there were two competing plans. One was the "McCall Plan" while the other was the "Paumier Plan." The estimated cost of "Paumier Plan" was \$5 million. The cost just to build one structure of the "McCall Plan", the Chrysalis, was \$6.4 million.

The transfer of ownership of Merriweather Post Pavilion from HHC to DCACC was facilitated through this trust. As an aside, MPBT also owned and transferred the Trademark License for "Merriweather Post" to DCACC.

As an aside, a blog with the same name emerged in 2019 fencing "independent", "organic" and "researched" stories to the public that actually appear to be a PR operation for the Downtown Columbia Plan. The Blogger would not answer whether he received express or implied permission from DCACC to use the name.



Another board member of the 2021 DCACC, Ms. Candace Dodson-Reed cohosts a podcast with developer attorney and 2013 CA Board member Tom Coale. She also worked in the Ken Ulman administration. Next, Mr. Louis Ulman is of course Mr. Ken Ulman's father.

Last, but not least, the Executive Director Mr. Ian Kennedy also worked for Mr. Ken Ulman as his Chief of Staff.

The 2013 charter board of the IAT comprised of Mr. Ed Coleman who currently serves as a member of the Planning Board. A county body that serves as a rubber stamp to any and all development.

It also includes Mr. Phil Nelson, who helped shepherd the creation of the IAT as CA Board President and of course Mr. Michael McCall, who earned a nearly \$1.03 million windfall over four years courtesy of taxpayer dollars.

Or would it be courtesy of County Executive Ken Ulman, Delegate Courtney Watson, who served in the County Council from 2006 to 2014, County Executive Calvin Ball, who served as Councilmember from 2006 to 2018, and State Senator Guy Guzzone who would facilitate the requisite state bond bill in the State Legislature. In June, 2020, <u>Columbia Association and Inner Arbor Trust filed a lawsuit</u> against the Downtown Columbia Arts and Culture Commission and It's my Amphitheater in Howard County Circuit Court to stop that year's annual Symphony of Lights.

The Graft Agreements

According to the lawsuit, DCACC and IMA put on the Symphony of Lights event without approval from Columbia Association, which owns various land-use rights for Symphony woods, which surrounds Merriweather Post Pavilion.

Various agreements between DCACC, MPBT, IAT, CA, HHC, and IMA enable access to the Pavilion during events. The relevant agreement descriptions and dates are found here.

The 2019 event took place without express approval from IAT and by extension Columbia Association. Instead, Howard County Department of Planning and Zoning under the control of County Executive Calvin Ball issued a permit.

But DPZ and County Executive Calvin Ball had no right to issue any permits since the easement is owned by CA. In helping IMA and DCACC, County Executive violated a basic principle of property rights. Even the county has to enter into an agreement with IAT and CA to be able to use a CA-owned facility. By tipping his hand into this disagreement on behalf of IMA, County Executive Ball exacerbated the dispute and hurt IAT and CA.

Specifically they say "Seven of the ten CA Board Members responsible for choosing the next president are up for re-election on April 24th. Given the timing of these elections, it is in the best interest of the incoming President, CA staff, the new CA Board and the community at-large to have the Columbia Association's new leader be selected by the people who will be in place when he or she is hired." Furthermore, "We call upon the Columbia Association Board of Directors to delay selection of the next President/CEO until after their April 24 election."

The reader will <u>remember that in 2016</u>, Senator Mitch McConnel denied confirmation of President Barack Obama's pick to the Supreme Court, Merrick Garland, for almost identical reasons. McConnel said "I believe the overwhelming view of the Republican Conference in the Senate is that this nomination should not be filled, this vacancy should not be filled by this lame duck president."

A New Scheme to Siphon Public Dollars

The Rouse Project wants to elect its preferred CA board members, much like the 2013 board who would vote as instructed to pick a new CA president and CEO. And much like

Mr. Phil Nelson, this new president would concoct a new scheme to siphon public dollars for private gain and guide the CA board through the perfunctory voting process. One of the board's new tasks would be to make permanent the temporary and illegal county-brokered arrangement that allows IMA to access CA owned land with impunity.

Of course this is the short term goal. In the mid and long term, this board will remove any structural barriers that potentially stand in the way of HHC. It will also serve as a launching off platform for future central committee members, county executives, and council members.

The reader will remember that at the heart of many of these deals is a zoning and land-use deal that would not be profitable without taxpayer dollars.

The Voter is Losing Trust in Government

Howard County's Democratic political establishment is simply a microcosm of what the voter is witnessing at the state and national levels.
